Funded by the Foundation for Integrated Transport, Action Vision Zero (AVZ) is committed to supporting campaigns eliminating road danger and traffic harm. Along with slower speeds, less traffic and safe road environments, safe behaviours and enforcement are priorities for AVZ.

AVZ's Police and Crime Commissioners 2021 election manifesto has been developed with RoadPeace and 20's Plenty for Us and is supported by British Cycling, Cycling UK, Living Streets, Road Danger Reduction Forum and Sustrans.

Greater transparency and accountability are priorities in the manifesto with calls for better enforcement data, including more timely data and at the local level. *What my police did in 2019* has been produced for each police service in England and Wales to promote understanding of police activity.
